INTRODUCTION - Observations

In sub-Saharan Africa, birth registration rates are below 50%.

In the poorest households, it is less than 30%.

2/3 of the deaths are never recorded and are therefore not counted in the vital statistics system.



However, it is necessary to specify that, these data concerning unregistered children are necessarily approximate. They are likely to be much larger.

INTRODUCTION – Civil Registration and Vital Statistics

*“A well-functioning **Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS)** system registers all **births and deaths**, issues birth and death certificates, and compiles and disseminates vital statistics, including cause of death information. It may also record **marriages and divorces**.*

*Despite the **well-documented benefits of CRVS**, many countries do not have adequate systems in place. The births of **tens of millions of children are known to be unregistered** every year, and it is estimated that **two-thirds of deaths are never registered** and are thus not counted in the vital statistics system.”*

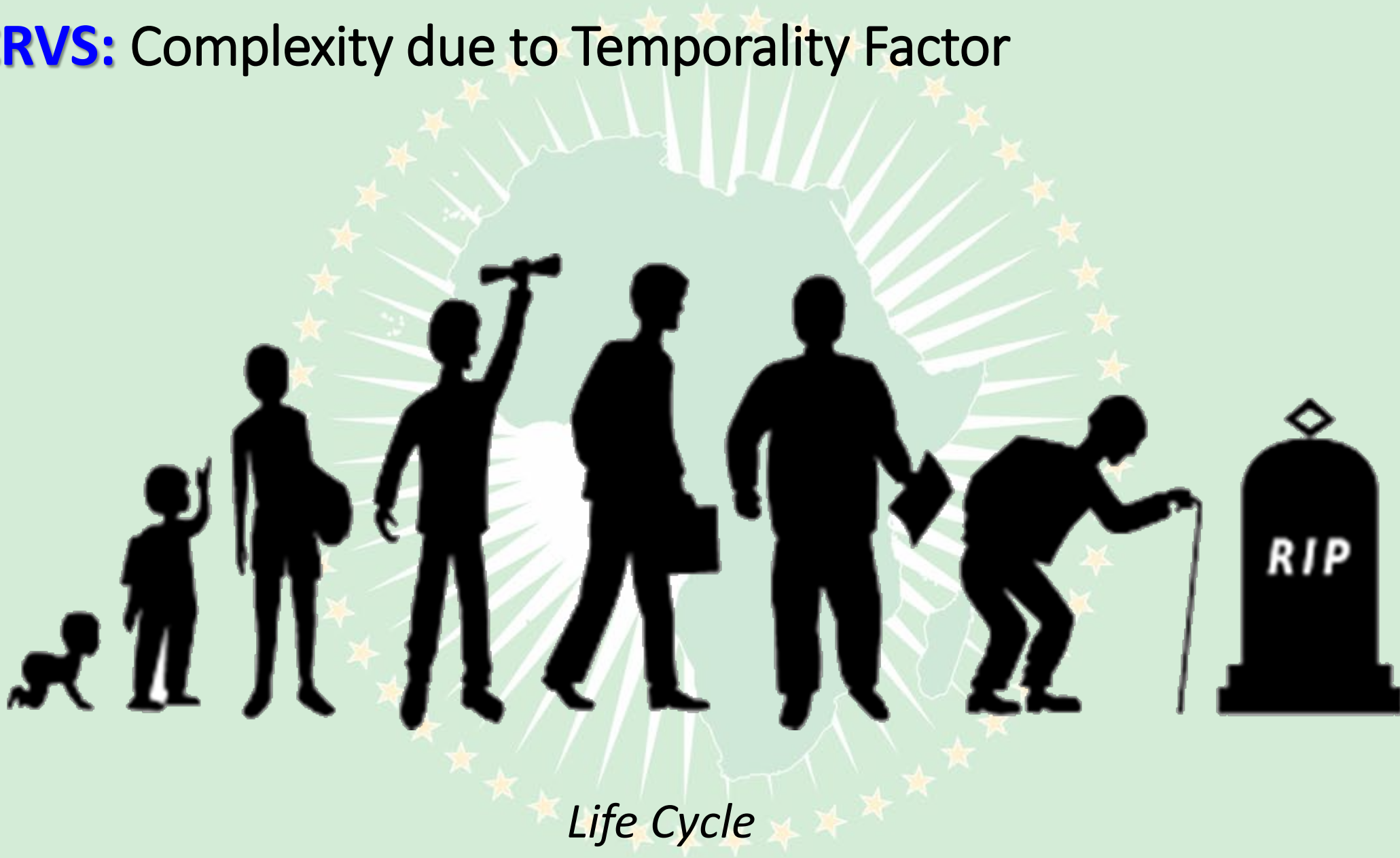

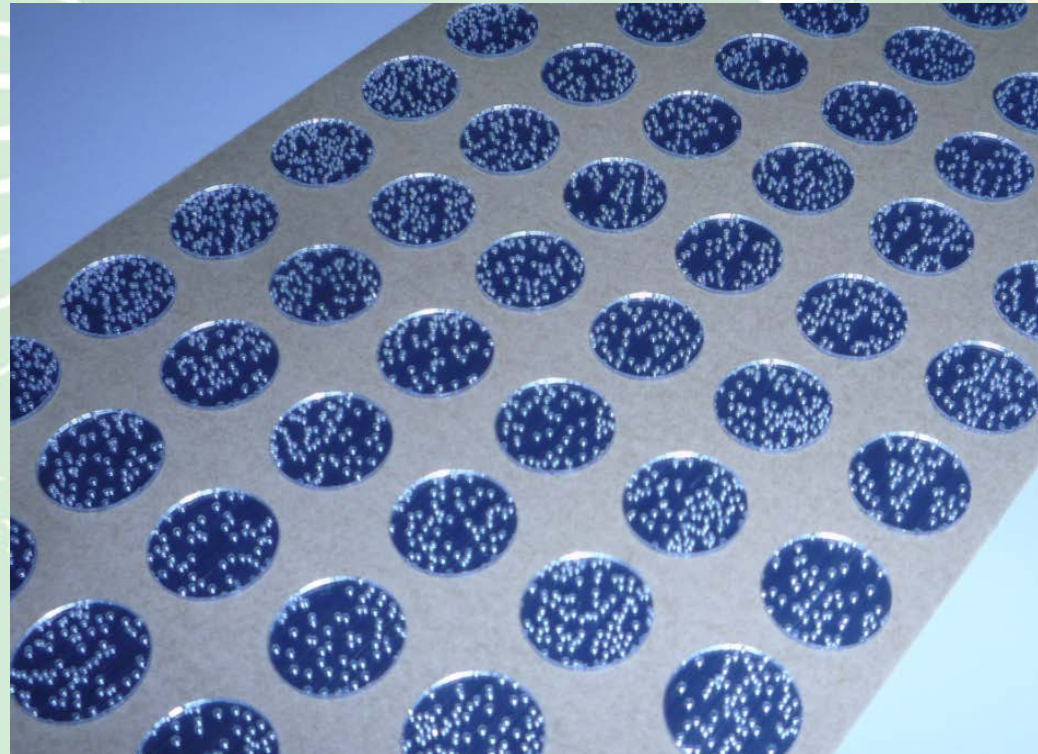


A **Bubble Tag Wristband** is placed around the wrist of the new born baby.

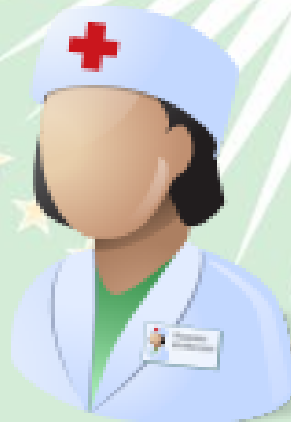

The **encrypted SMS** is processed. A SMS is sent back to confirm **safe receipt**

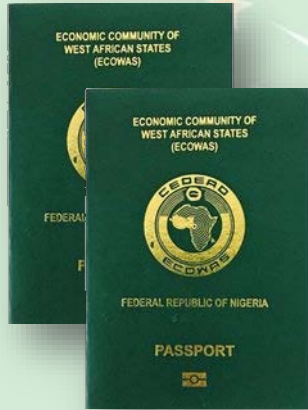

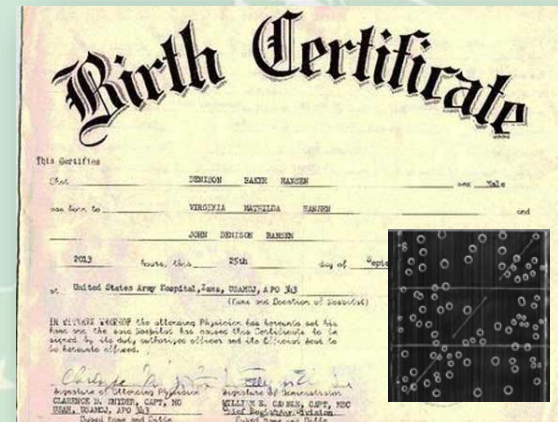
On presentation of the **Bubble Tag Wristband** together with his **ID Document**, the **Officer** can issue the birth certificate to the **Citizen**

STRENGTHS OF THE SOLUTION

• The Bubble Tag Wristband

- Ensures the interphase link
- Can not be duplicated
- Unique: It is a self-generated chaosmetric 3D code, resulting from a natural phenomenon
- An unpredictable digital signature
- Total traceability of actors
- Digital and electronic authentication
- Does not break down
- Durability over 250 years

• Application for Smartphone iCivil

- Total traceability of agents
- Guarantee of the integrity and authenticity of the collected data
- Geolocation of the place of declaration

• Other advantages

- Compatibility with the communication networks already available
- Rapid constitution of the national registry of civil status
- Highly secure ecosystem
- Declaration and registration of large scale births without risk of duplication,
- Provision of secure and controllable civil status records
- Provides reliable, complete and real-time statistics to the authorities, the administration, the technical and financial partners
- Facilitates the planning, implementation and evaluation of the development policies.

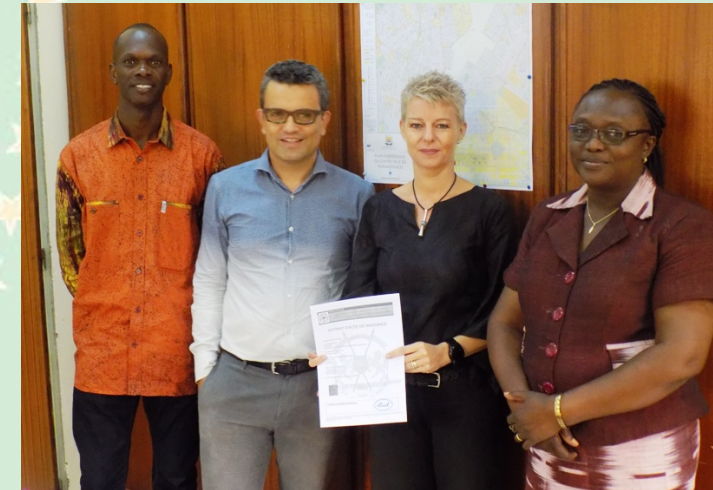
