

ID4Africa Expands its Ambassador Program: Announces Ambassadors from 19 African Countries

New York, New York, United States: ID4Africa, the Movement promoting the responsible adoption of digital identity as a force for social and economic development in Africa, announced its 2017 class of Ambassadors. The Ambassador program, which was conceived of a year ago, has now tripled in size with 19 Ambassadors appointed representing over 60% of sub-Saharan Africa by population.

The ID4Africa Ambassadors, all of whom are African government employees, are identity experts who volunteer their time to promote the responsible use of digital identity in Africa and act as important liaisons between ID4Africa and the institutions and identity stakeholders in their respective countries. They ensure that their countries' issues and concerns are part of the collective agenda of the Movement and that their countries are well represented in their delegations to the ID4Africa Annual Meeting.

This year ID4Africa received an unprecedented number of applications from prospective government officials from nearly every African country. The successful applicants were selected based on merit and experience.

ID4Africa Executive Chairman, Dr. Joseph J. Atick said *"We are thrilled with the level of interest that we have seen in the program and the engagement that the Ambassadors have exhibited. This is a force for good to be reckoned with."* He added *"Because of their involvement we are able to get closer to the issues and better understand the identification needs and challenges country by country, which enables our movement to be more impactful and responsive."*
